Student ID Cards

The first day back after Camp Hamilton, students will receive their EAS student ID cards with barcode and photo. Students are expected to bring their student ID card to school every day. Student ID cards are necessary to check out books from the school library, to issue required textbooks, and to purchase lunch in the school cafeteria. Lost or damaged student ID cards will be replaced for a \$5.00 fee. This same information will be conveyed to students when their ID cards are distributed to them after camp.
