## Quick Facts

- EAS is a 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade middle school open to students who reside in the LWSD boundaries.
- EAS maintains a total base enrollment (6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades combined) of 140 students.
- Enrollment at EAS is determined through a district-run lottery process.
- Due to the spiraling 3-year curriculum cycle at EAS, it is important that students who enroll in 6<sup>th</sup> grade commit to enrollment for the full three years of middle school.
- Parent volunteers are essential for the successful operation of the Adventure Education, Community Stewardship, and Wednesday Electives Programs at EAS.
- Adventure Education (camps and trips), Community Stewardship, and Wednesday Electives are core components of overall academics at EAS. Students may not opt out of these essential components of the EAS integrated curriculum.
- Parent financial support is essential for the ongoing operation of EAS Adventure Education, Community Stewardship and Wednesday Electives programs.
